1. WELCOME:

Mykola welcomed the group and everyone introduced themselves.

The meeting was called to order and the following items were added to the agenda:

- Continued discussion from previous meeting
- Basketball Survey

2. DISCUSSION CONTINUED FROM JOINT COUNCIL MEETING:

- Moving to a digital work and information sharing has changed so BC School Sports should reflect those changes in how it handles its AGMs.
- Membership has made it clear that they want to increase participation and it is felt that on-line voting does this.
- Re Proxy voting, some felt there was room for abuse. Use of technology can still be engaging.
- Want to ensure that participants are engaged in discussions.
- There are online tools that can engage participants better than proxy voting.
- Previous decision was an advanced vote, but last year Board decided to have vote only on the day of the AGM.
- What is the best way to engage more people?
- Operating Rules indicates next AGM is to be in Prince George.
- Process is that decisions are made at AGM. Advisory Committee to advise Board re Constitution and Bylaws, and should not be hashed out at Association Presidents meeting.
- Association President's meeting is an opportunity to have meaningful discussions and to hear varying perspectives.
- Some say that online voting does not provide an educated decision or vote.
- May have lower participation at AGM and hear only special interest groups because we ask volunteers to give
 up their Saturdays.
- Some are more interested in coaching and making a positive experience for kids, rather than being engaged in the activities of BC School Sports.
- Most Athletic Association Presidents find that they have opportunities to meet prior to the AGM with their groups/stakeholders to discuss the Motions and Resolutions put forward for the AGM, so they are prepared to vote at AGM.
- Some would like the on-line voting to be open for longer.
- Would changing the date to a common non-instructional time in June, when school year is over, provide greater participation?
- School Districts should put in place money for schools to attend AGM.

- Only 4 out of 11 participated from Richmond last year, therefore think there was less engagement.
- There were 54 in person votes and 36 online votes, which is 90 individuals voting; therefore think there was more engagement than the previous year were there was only 57 individuals voting.
- In the mid-80's BCSS added allure to the AGM's by paying for flights, and then bus to Whistler and it was a social event with a chance to network. Should the AGM's be more entertaining in order to increase participation?
- There were 17 of the total 18 Vancouver Athletic Association schools attending the AGM.
- People want to be able to still do proxy voting and some people still want to be able to vote on-line.
- Recommend that AGM be done in conjunction with a PRO-D piece and then people can apply for funds to assist with travel and TOCs.
- How do other provinces do it?
- Consensus is that group does not want to change from 20% to 20.
- Re STARS
 - Misinformation that schools cannot enter students without first having paid membership fees
 - Some find it onerous to add students to team rosters
 - Date formatting would be better if it matched BCESIS

 - Girls Volleyball will resubmit tiering rule change to AGM
- Basketball Survey:
 - Where is information? Survey just finished Thursday. Decision on Basketball will be made public as soon as decision made.
