1. CALL TO ORDER (Raj Puri, President, (North Surrey Secondary School)

### 1.1. Special General Meeting Opening:

The President introduced himself and thanked all delegates for attending. The passion for students and sport was recognized. Guests were welcomed: trustees, superintendents, school administrators; and were thanked for coming. General information about the meeting and announcements for the morning's proceedings were made.

### 1.2. Introductions:

The President had members of the BC SCHOOL SPORTS Board of Directors introduce themselves.

## 3. SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING BUSINESS

### 3.1 Framework and Current Reality of BCSS (Raj Puri)

The current reality of BCSS was presented, highlighting how the organization had been in the best situation possible last year as reported at the Annual General meeting.

Upon announcement of $\$ 130000$ funding cut on July 24, 2009, the board began immediate discussions to understand why and how this occurred as well as the overall ramifications. A cut or decrease could have been anticipated but not a total cut of all provincial funding.

Government needed to make a decision, ministry of healthy living and sport responsible for BCSS was cut 35\% to their total budget ( $\$ 14$ million out of sport). There were also major impacts on other government sources of funding - Ministry of Education - Insurance as well as Gaming - Provincial Championships.

To ensure communicate with the membership, an initial information and discussion package was distributed at the start of school year. One approach was to offer a core services model only, which would get BCSS through the end of the calendar year while the Board explored other options to ensure a sustainable solution. Money was requested from school districts and will also be requested from the independent schools (which represent $25 \%$ of the BCSS membership) to help make up shortfall.

He acknowledged work that Board and Executive Director have done to address this crisis:

- Kathy in the office looking after finances and preparing material for this meeting
- Have been short staffed, therefore workload has increased for all
- Board has scrambled to allow BCSS to move forward

A starting point was the resolution that was sent out to all member schools in package \#2 in the hopes to inspire other possible thoughts and or recommendations.

Looked at several options:

- Band-aid solution of asking our partners for help in maing it through the school year
- Fee increase from each member school to allow BCSS to become selfsustaining
- Dissolve as an organization

Feedback provided to date has clearly supported BCSS in its efforts to continue being able to offer sport for students.

Raj also emphasized before getting into the Business portion of the meeting that every member's opinion matters. He would like to have respectful dialogue and debate. Take a professional, not personal, approach. Wants to be able to build off suggestions that the Board will put forward based on input received here today.

Confirmed that there were no outstanding questions.
Introduced Mr. Barrie Lynch, the Parliamentarian for the resolution portion of the meeting.

### 3.2 2008-2009 Audited Financial Statement (Sue Keenan)

Two key areas to be covered: audit and general operating cost

Reiterated the praise for the work of Kathy and Jim over past several months as we have all been scrambling to minimize the impacts on the school year start up.

Highlighted presentation to 12 MLAs last week about the need for, and impact of school sports. Information was very well received however there is still no money to be received this year and likely not next year. In the last three years, half a million dollars have been received from Sports Funders which has significantly helped senior teams. Sports Funder no longer exists.

### 3.2.1 Audit

Exhibit A: Snapshot and overview of the organization.
Schedule 1: Receipts.
$\$ 162,522$ (including the money from the Ministry for Championships).
$\$ 97,000$ was travel funding,
\$14,185 banners,
\$3,956.50 for medals, \$20,000 BC EMB, and \$21,000 Subway.

Schedule 2: Expenditures
Includes an over-expenditure in the staffing item due to training (as a result of maternity leave), as well as the over-expenditure for AGM (resulting from taking AGM out of lower mainland).

Overall operating deficit of $\$ 86,739$.
$\$ 38,000$ from the travel reserve, $\$ 10,000$ overspent for staff cost, \$7,000 AGM costs, \$21,000 Deferred Subway Scholarship money, and \$10,000 BCSS deferred scholarship money

## Questions:

Sue clarified that $\$ 17,000$ deficit position (day to day) largely due to BCSS staffing and AGM costs. We were overspent in budget of last year - first time in seven years. Board of Directors was aware of this situation which was unplanned due to unforeseen circumstances.

### 3.2.2 Operating Cost Projections:

Emphasized that these numbers are only projections. \$464,450 is the anticipated revenue for this year (does not take into account ordinary net income)

This includes: taking out \$130,000 from provincial government and, adding in district regional grants $\sim \$ 50000$ to date

BCSS is gauging public system first; will be asking independent schools for additional $\$ 300$ (category 5 and up) by the end of the year. Schools below category 5 will be asked for $\$ 150$. This request is contingent upon today's meeting.

With all the cuts made, but not insurance still anticipating a $\$ 30000$ net deficit.
There are several additional cuts that can be made: the first series of cuts made and have been incorporated into this document, others will be considered when budget is reworked and finalized by the Board in December. An update will be forwarded to all member schools to continue to ensure transparency and to continue to enhance communication.

BCSS has given notice to be out of office and is currently negotiating with Langley and Maple Ridge school districts for office space. Previously in 2007 prior to signing a new commercial lease Sue had approached several districts in the Vancouver metro area with nothing available at that time. Now we are focusing our efforts further into the suburbs which may yield better potential for space.

She also emphasized that BCSS is the centralized administrative support for the sport commissions and that corporate support will not be found for that administration.

## Questions:

Projected expenditures? \$496,660. Does not include insurance (which covers all of the coverage and liability for provincial championships)

Clarify which scenarios the projected revenue is based upon? Cuts that were made initially, those built into first document. That translates into core services only.

Member voiced that his independent school appreciated the work of BCSS and that they would support the organization financially.

Rob Columbo emphasized that further cuts will have huge impact as administratively BCSS is as thin as can be.

## 4. FUTURE OF BC SCHOOL SPORTS (Raj Puri)

Trying to ensure that financially BCSS can finish out this school year.
In meeting with the Minister and Deputy Ministers, Raj discovered there is a lack of awareness for what BCSS members do. The way grants worked last year (separate asks) is not an acceptable method anymore; ministry is looking for a restructured single ask. Ministry is wanting to know exactly what organizations are trying to do (participation versus elite debate). Provincial government has lack of awareness particularly with where BCSS fits. Next year is targeted to be worse money will likely be under a different structure (sport organizations in sport sector rather than education sector). An amalgamation of sorts.......being proposed by an entity know as the Sport Alliance?

The official decision makers are not able to see dollars translating into outcomes (accountability for work is not visible to government).

BCSS have looked internally at cuts that have been made that will impact the following: Coaching recognition - downsized significantly Staffing positions - 2 part time positions cut, further reductions being proposed for the remaining 2.5 FTEs. resulting in office closure at certain times during the year, Christmas, Spring Break and Summer In person meetings cancelled for the remainder of this year. Committee structure to be re-exmined for future years.
Handbook - no further hard copies will be printed, everything will be on-line Office space and services - moving to a school site.

### 4.1 Identification of Scrutineers:

Two individuals volunteered to keep track of the voting numbers throughout the Resolution discussion.

Questions: Clarification of the Current Status for 2009-2010

Proposed cuts identified in package \#2 are secondary cuts that would hopefully cover the current deficit. Core services can continue through this school year, assuming that the continued support of schools and Districts exists. Discussion today is for the 2010-2011 school year.

How many student athletes are registered? ~96,000 for 2008-2009
What is a legitimate operating cost? $\$ 600,000$ for support, services, administration and insurance. This works out to about \$6-\$7 per student athlete.

Concern from one member's district is that nobody else is running without a deficit so why does BCSS believe that they should be operating without a deficit.

Our biggest problem from the government's point of view is lack of awareness. How is
this going to be addressed? Raj described how relationship has been formed (Raj and Sue having toured the school districts) and was strong but Minister has changed, therefore the relationship needs to be forged again. This is how it began; coaches recognition and insurance have come out of these things. BCSS needs to re-educate the players who are out there, although we are now limited since it requires resources.

Member from North Shore Athletics Association identified that pros outweigh cons of BCSS and that the government will not budge, happy with the financials that they saw, feel that we should support the Board and move forward with the recommendation.

DAVE CHAMBERS (Robert Bateman) - not alone in this. National Sport Organizations are in same situation where kids are having to pay to play. Organization at school sports has been so inexpensive or free for so long, it questions how good it can be relative to independent sport.

Kids who don't have financial means will have an impact on those kids having the opportunity to participate in sport. Curious about Minister's response about this (healthcare implications)

## 5. MEMBERSHIP DISCUSSION (Barrie Lynch)

### 5.1 Explanation of Meeting Proceedings, Parliamentary Procedure as it applies to this special meeting and Voting

The only action that can happen is one identified in the agenda.
The 14 day notice was adequate. Fees are normally set at AGM; that was done. Board is recommending a change of those fees which requires 14 days notice and in this circumstance, it falls short therefore the majority must be $2 / 3$ as per societal rules.

### 5.2 Announcement of Registered Votes

The registered votes present today, in person or proxy is 196. The majority needed today (of $2 / 3$ ) is $\mathbf{1 3 1}$ votes. A simple majority of votes is $50 \%+1$ (99).

### 5.3 Resolution

WHEREAS, the provincial Transfer Agreement Grant of $\$ 130,000$ has been cut effective July 24, 2009

## AND

WHEREAS, we do not anticipate a grant from the Ministry of Education of $\$ 50,000$ to offset the organizations liability insurance in the future

## AND

WHEREAS, we do not know if gaming funding will be accessible in the future,

## AND

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the current financial audit for the organization and has begun the process of developing a new budget plan.

MOVED: \{SEMENOFF, (Brocklehurst) / THORNE, (Prince Charles) \} BE IT RESOLVED that a membership fee increase of up to $75 \%$ at the discretion of the Board of Directors be implemented in the 2010-2011 school year making BCSS financially self sustaining

## Discussion:

RANDY SEMENOFF: Spoke for the amendment and iterated the value of BCSS, highlighting over 100000 participants, sport for youth and the offering of leadership academies for youth.

RALPH STEVENS (Vernon) - no question that what Board is proposing is good. Concerned about whether it is the right time. He cannot see the value of voting on a solution at this time since there is so much uncertainty. Would prefer that it be tabled until May AGM

Clarification that $75 \%$ increase allows for operating above the core services. Believes that this is a small increase per student athlete. Barrie confirmed that the proposed increase of up to $75 \%$ is for operations above the core services.

CARL REPP (Belmont Secondary school) - supports the motion but does not support the timing of it. Also is concerned that if we support this now, it may prohibit the opportunity for Sport and Education to be combined.

DON MOSLIN (council of Sport Commissions) - From their meeting, we unanimously support the recommendation.

PAUL EBERHARDT (R C Palmer) - need to be clearer about what we do. Concerned about what happens once we start this process as you will never get funding back (if self-sustaining). Further cuts will mean other funders will never support the membership.

SUE THORNE (Prince Charles) - Board needs to know now what kind of feeling the membership has so that they can plan for next year.

ED GARLINGE (Esquimalt High) - BCSS offers amazing opportunities but if we are making the cuts, then everyone must shoulder the cuts.

HUGH MCKINNON (Glacier View Alternate School) - identified attending voters' age (many over 40 in the room) yet younger coaches may not be present. They need to get involved to make this a vital organization. Secondly, public schools have a history of covering the costs of the have not schools. They have been the last equal opportunity for all. That this is not recognized by government is worrying as cost to community will be larger in the long term. Issue needs to stay on the table even though he supports the motion. Parents can effect change. It is incumbent to raise the profile, not just the championships won. Give the MLAs the message of importance of extra curricular activities, especially sport.

DAVE CHAMBERS (Robert Bateman Secondary) - BCSS is us. Motion is UP TO $75 \%$ increase and that means if it is possible for a smaller increase, then it will be. Government will not give anything back.

SEAN Lamoureux (Kamloops) - this breaks down to $\$ 1.50 /$ kid, less than a pop per student athlete. While $75 \%$ seems huge, the cost per person is not.

ANDREW LEIGHTON (Thomas Haney) - sends a message that we can accept the cuts. Dislikes accepting the motion as it sends a message that we will roll over and accept the lack of support. It is the perception that he opposes.

JOHN PHILLIP (Parksville) - two speakers ask that motion be tabled. There will be no meeting in 2010. Barrie clarifies that AGM must occur but that no Board or committee meetings occur. His school has had over $\$ 70000$ taken in cuts already.

MIKE ALLINA (Point Grey) - instructed by members to vote against based on the principle. When will the government stop? Is the option to breakaway completely - just do it, do it cleanly.

MARION MCNEIL (Seaquam Secondary) - BCSS involvement since 1974, experienced similar situation in mid-80s. This board didn't have the warning that the Board did at that time, which is why they need to have this year to plan and to source proper sponsorship.

RALPH STEVENS (W.L. Seaton) - can this item be tabled? He doesn't feel comfortable voting on something without the information or the opportunity to get a sense of real sponsorship opportunities that may exist.

Barrie confirms that a motion can be made but if the motion on the table stands and is defeated, that it is the same as postponing/tabling the motion. Clarification was also made that fees were set in 2009 for the 2010-2011 school year.

MOVED \{STEVENS (W.L. Seaton)/ JOHN BLAI R (J N Burnett) \} BE IT RESOLVED TO postpone this until the following AGM.

## MOTION FAI LS

GLEN JOHNSON (Seminal Secondary) - clarification that there is nothing further to cut (correct). This motion allows us to be a separate entity, no longer relying on government. Not jumping from ministry of education

JASON FISHER (Hope Secondary) - doesn't believe we can be severed from government. His school has had a $\$ 5000$ personal cut and Board has required a $\$ 20$ per student fee for sport. As a small school, there won't be much support or chance to come up with extra cash.

STEVEN ROWELL (Robert Bateman Secondary) - self sustaining does not mean cutting off dialogue. July $24^{\text {th }}$ was date that budget cut was learned. Raj confirmed that there has been one meeting in Victoria, 2-3 meetings by phone, meeting last night. Dialogue has been happening. Must still explore all options.

DANIEL TO (Earl Marriott Secondary) - School board budgets are set in February/March. If we ask for money in May, budget is already set. Second, if BCSS goes under, it doesn't mean we stop dealing with eligibility, travel, equipment. The cost per commission is absurd to do it separately.
